Dear Praying Friends,

For the past nine months, whenever someone would notice that we were expecting our firstborn, the same refrain would echo forth: "your life will never be the same after he comes."

We never knew quite how to respond to this oft repeated phrase. Laurel and I both watched our parents raise our younger siblings and thought we had a pretty good handle on what to expect. But as it turns out, watching and doing are two very different things.

Athan requires more time and effort than we could have possibly imagined. He is absolutely dependent on us for everything! Experimentally realizing how much children need their parents has made the

Romanian abandonment situation even more reprehensible to us than before—something we hadn't previously imagined possible.

Additionally, the birth of our son has given us a fuller understanding of Jesus' willing humility to come as a helpless baby, and the enormity our Heavenly Father's sacrifice of His only Son for our sins.

Thank you for praying both for the birth of our son and for the ministry in Romania. We look forward to sharing with you how God continues to work.
